RESOLUTION NUMBER R2013 - ___ (Santa Rosa County)

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ESCAMBIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, and SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING WORKFORCE ESCAROSA'S REQUEST TO WAIVE THE ITA/TRAINING EXPENDITURE REQUIREMENT; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Congress passed the Workforce Investment Act of 1998 (WIA), 29 U.S.C.A. §§2801-2945, to maximize federally funded job training programs and create a comprehensive, locally controlled workforce investment system in order to allow Americans access to career management tools and enable U.S. companies to recruit a qualified workforce to compete in a global economy; and

WHEREAS, the workforce investment system is designed for federal, state and local partners to work cooperatively whereby local workforce investment boards, in partnership with local elected officials, plan and oversee the local system while state workforce investment boards provide statewide policy, guidance and interpretation; and

WHEREAS, in order to implement the provisions of the federal WIA, the State of Florida passed the Workforce Innovation Act, §§445.01 et seq., Florida Statutes, creating Workforce Florida, Inc., and establishing regional workforce boards to serve as the local workforce investment boards tasked with specified duties and functions as determined by law and as set forth by interlocal agreement approved by the two local governing bodies; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Interlocal Agreement, Workforce Escarosa, Inc., currently serves as the regional workforce board for Escambia and Santa Rosa County providing public workforce services, job training programs and economic development related to the WIA; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Workforce Board Accountability Act (RWBAA) amended the Florida Workforce Innovation Act which requires 50% of WIA Adult and Dislocated Worker funds be expended on tuition, books and fees of training providers and other training services prescribed in WIA for Individual Training Accounts, but does allow for a waiver if supported by the Chief Elected Officials; and

WHEREAS, the Santa Rosa County and the Escambia County Commissioners have determined that the request for a waiver of the 50% training requirement is justified.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ESCAMBIA COUNTY AND SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS :

SECTION 1. That the Board of County Commissioners of Santa Rosa County and Escambia County, Florida hereby find the above recitals to be true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

SECTION 2. That the Board of County Commissioners of Escambia County and Santa Rosa County hereby fully support the waiver request of Workforce Escarosa and the waiver be reduced by 10% down to a 40% training expenditure requirement.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption by the both Board of County Commissioners.

SECTION 4. That the Clerk of Court is hereby directed to forward a copy of this resolution to the Workforce Florida, Inc., and the Regional Workforce Board's Chairperson.

Factors Related to Need for 40% ITA Waiver Request:

- Cost Allocation process will require that WIA Adult funds be allocated to cover a larger portion of upfront services to include job search assistance due to reductions in Wagner Peyser and significant reductions in WIA Youth and TANF
- Due to budget reductions, 7 FTE Escarosa staff positions were eliminated and 5 FTE from the Welfare Transition program were reassigned.
- Training related items which **are not counted** toward the 50% ITA expenditure definition, needed to attend school (uniforms, immunizations, tools, supplies) will be limited and may be discontinued for WIA Adult participants if the ITA Waiver request is not approved.
- For FY 2012 – 2013, Escarosa expended approximately \$1.9 million on ITA approved definition categories which count toward the 50% ITA expenditure requirement. Of that amount approximately \$1.5 million was expended on tuition and books **ONLY**. Due to budget cuts, funding available for tuition and books **ONLY** will be reduced by \$530,000, down to \$925,000.
- For FY 2013 -2014, approximately \$533,074 of WIA Adult will be needed to support Wagner Peyser Universal and Upfront Services, and the Welfare Transition Program to insure services to job seekers and recruitment for new and/or expanding businesses are not reduced and/or eliminated.
- For FY 2012 -2013, Escarosa served approximately 730 students on average per semester. With the reduced funding, Escarosa plans on serving approximately 530 students on average per semester. The reductions will be achieved through graduations, completers and normal attrition.

Workforce Florida, Inc., (WFI) Board of Directors approved several options for regional workforce boards (RWB) in regard to requesting an ITA Waiver. On July 10, 2013, the WFI Board approved allowing current RWBs with ITA approved Waivers for FY 2012 -2013, to request the same waiver amount for FY 2013 -2014 as previously approved if 1) The Board of County Commissioners approves the RWB Waiver Request, and if 2) the RWB Board of Directors approves the ITA Waiver request.

On June 19, 2013, the Workforce Escarosa Board of Directors approved an ITA Waiver request for FY 2013 -2014 at the current waiver amount of 40%.

Action Required: Workforce Escarosa is requesting that the Santa Rosa County Board of County Commissioners and the Escambia County Board of County Commissioners concur and approve Workforce Escarosa's request for a 40% ITA Waiver.

The application deadline for the Defense Infrastructure Grant (DIG) cycle is August 23, 2013 and the deadline for the Defense Reinvestment Grant (DRG) cycle is August 16, 2013. We are currently preparing the following applications:

Joint Land Use Plan Acquisition Funding – DIG
Request \$200,000

This project continues to implement the acquisition of properties and the development rights of properties as recommended by the previously FDA funded Joint Land Use Plan (DIG00-02). Fee simple acquisition and acquisition of development rights are two of the strategies (among others such as zoning reclassification) designated by Santa Rosa County to avoid incompatible development, prevent encroachment on the military mission, and allow for future use as deemed appropriate.

Military Consultant Funding - DRG
Request \$84,800

Requests funds for a consultant to represent Santa Rosa County in activities concerning DoD, Dept of the Navy, Dept of the Air Force and other armed forces. Provides support for events and functions that reinforce positive relations between the community and the defense facility. Also includes request for funds in the amount of \$30,000 to research, develop and update a Technical Skills Inventory initially funded with a 2001 CDG grant in partnership with Haas Center.

E. Grant Purpose:

1. General.

Maximize military need for NAS Whiting Field (NASWF) to minimize potential for base closure or realignment initiatives on Santa Rosa County (SRC), develop alternative economic diversification strategies to lessen reliance on national defense dollars, maintain constant dollar levels in the local area as commercialization continues, and provide an adequate infrastructure to support an increasing demand for affordable housing and expanding industrial job base.

2. Funding Requirments. Request funding for the following project activities:

a. Provide for a consultant that will represent Santa Rosa County in activities concerning DoD, Dept. of the Navy, Dept. of the Air Force and any other armed forces. The consultant will coordinate tasks and duties that sustain and grow the county's military presence, and participate in activities to enhance those activities that reduce the county's dependence on military (i.e., Whiting Aviation Park). The consultant will provide periodic reports complete with updates and recommendations to the Santa Rosa County Military Affairs Committee, the Board of County Commissioners and other entities as directed. The resultant deliverables expected include, but are not limited to:

- Placing the county in a BRAC ready position;
- Bettering our relationship with military installations, state and other counties;
- Monitor and interact as necessary concerning Navy and county progress with respect to initial phases of land swaps and other land dispositions;
- Liaison and interact with military and prospect/existing industries as necessary;
- Liaison and interact with chamber military affairs committees;

- Liaison and interact with congressional offices;
 - Provide support and interaction for the multi-county Defense Support Initiative.
 - Provide coordination on updating and implementation of the SRC Joint Land Use Study.
- b. Provide for a consultant that will research, develop, and update a Technical Skills Inventory for the local area that can be used by SRC Economic Development for enticing industry to relocate to the Milton area.
- This inventory will take into account the large number of retired military possessing technical skills directly related to the aviation industry.
 - The Haas Center, University of West Florida developed the initial Technical Skills Inventory under CDG-01-10 and it is expected that the Haas Center will be sole sourced for this project.
- c. Provide support for events and functions that reinforce positive relations between the community and the defense facility. These events and functions include:
- Annual fly-in and briefing of the appropriate training and operations Flag Officers to ensure they are aware of the progress the Navy and local governments are making to protect and enhance NASWF and other surrounding installations.
 - SRC's Military Affairs Committee meeting with military representatives on matters related to workforce, land use, and encroachment, and other issues as necessary; and providing information throughout the community on the positive impacts the military and DoD, its contractors, and its retirees make on our community.
 - Facilitate and host, as necessary, community events that recognize the contributions made by the military, further open lines of communication between the military and civilian communities, and promote the education of the civilian and military communities on the benefits gained through active participation with each other.
 - Participate in the NW Florida Defense Coalition delegation to Washington DC, sponsoring SRC Military Affairs Committee members.
- d. Provide support for administration of the approved grant.

F. Economic Impact Statement.

1. Total value of defense-related payrolls \$30,300,000¹

This information cannot be captured nor estimated from a county perspective. This is a regional funding, and in many cases, may include multi-state spending.

8. Estimated value of technology transfer initiatives as a result of synergies between the military, industry, and academia \$156,000⁴

- G. Does the Project Relate to Other Local/State/Federal Budgets Yes

A mission of the SRC Board of Commissioners is to provide economic development services. These services receive funding from the Board of County Commissioners taxing authority and all incorporated Cities and Towns within Santa Rosa County, as well as the private sector. The tasks included within this grant application will directly support the economic development efforts of Santa Rosa County.

- H. Cross-pollinating State Success:

Encroachment impacts all military activities within the state. Cross-utilization of encroaching properties that may promote “dual-use” can establish the foundation for economic stabilization due to job creation, maintaining constant dollars, provide a stepping stone for possible reuse, and promote diversification. The County is continuing to determine a means to leverage various funds to further the protection of NAS Whiting Field as it did with the purchase of the property for Whiting Aviation Park, which now serves as a model for other military installations for their JLUS efforts.

- I. Community Support and Involvement:

1. Santa Rosa County is committed to the protection and well being of NAS Whiting Field. The community leaders and government officials realize that very few industries can rival the economic and social impact of NAS Whiting Field and its mission.
2. Our community places a high priority on retaining existing industry as part of our overall economic development strategy. We realize that nurturing and protecting the jobs already established within a community creates a healthy business environment and in turn leads to additional business and industry moving into the area. It is easier to take care of what we have than it is to endure the problems associated with the loss of a major business or industry. Military is currently our #1 industry in Santa Rosa County, just ahead of tourism. Using this asset to build on and develop the Gulf Coast Aerospace and Defense Coalition is a focus of Santa Rosa County.
3. NAS Whiting Field is not merely an industry; it is a way of life to many in this community. The men and women of NAS Whiting Field are part of the community. The efforts of these individuals in our schools and within the community cannot be measured in dollars and cents.
4. The work ethic associated with military retirees and separatees is invaluable and adds to our region’s ability to attract high quality aerospace and defense contractors. This asset must be protected.

- J. Local Match Documentation: Santa Rosa County has committed to provide the amount of local match that is required. As in prior years, the amount of local match is expected to far exceed the required 30% match and will, for the most part, be made up by in-kind contributions which will include volunteer time and expenses. Historically, Santa Rosa County has provided a 40-60% match.

The ongoing work and activity of volunteers on behalf of this organization and this community in military retention is invaluable. These volunteers provide communication regarding regional and legislative military activity, and will serve as liaison from this community to the Florida Defense Alliance. The volunteer members of this project will:

- Monitor overall status of the defense industry in Santa Rosa County.
- Attend military sponsored functions, participate in the planning, facilitating and strategies for multi-community/media awareness and participate in military appreciation functions.
- Attend bi-monthly Santa Rosa County Military Affairs Committee meetings and report to the Board of County Commissioners.

Based on our discussions, we are submitting the following fee proposal for your review, comment and approval.

We have attached a fee spreadsheet to define our efforts during this schematic design phase. This is in line with the presentation made to the Board of County Commissioners on July 22, 2013 and further conversations with you. This spreadsheet is the same format and following the same State of Florida fee guidelines as defined by our March 21, 2000 Agreement with you.

The fee spreadsheet is built to define all the design services that may be needed as the project moves into full design. At this time some of the fees are undetermined, but can used as the basis of developing a comprehensive project budget with the County. We have scaled back the design effort from a full Schematic Design effort to deliver just what you need for approval, presentation and budgeting at this time. all more detailed work will be deferred until after the referendum.

We have concentrated our efforts for defining scope on this initial phase, from now to the end of the year. When we have completed this phase we will be better able to quantify the design effort going forward. The fee for the future phases of this project will be based on the state Florida fee guidelines and our complete understanding of the projects scope once the tax referendum is complete. The biggest potential areas of change at the moment are the inclusion of the State Attorney's office in the new building and how much of the Clerk (and other ancillary support functions) will be housed.

We will also, at that time, have a defined site and can predict all the engineering issues related to site development. We don't know yet if there will be wetland delineation or off site utility upgrades required.

Most of the work is defined as a lump sum fee. We have, however, included some allowances that will be spent at your direction. One for assistance in selecting sites and then analyzing their suitability for the project, the other for our assistance in making public presentations in the run-up to the Sales Tax Referendum during 2014. We are assuming that the County will supply a survey of the proposed property. The Geotechnical evaluation (to determine foundation design) will also be carried out through independent County contract.

Our team continues to be led by myself from HOK (Architecture, Interior Design, and Security Planning) and Mike Broussard from Hatch Mott MacDonald (Civil Engineering, Survey, Landscape and Structural Design)



We are excited about getting started again, and to be working with the Board of County Commissioners.

We could start as soon as approved; we would set up the program verification meetings to run in parallel to the site selection process.

The following (very) preliminary costs are based on the 2012 FDOT D-3 Preliminary Estimate Transportation Costs planning rates provided by FDOT:

Surface Roadway = \$555,000
Medium Height Bridge = \$12,320,000
High Height Bridge = \$107,000,000
Traffic Signals = \$440,000
Stormwater = \$660,000

Total construction = \$120,975,000

These costs DO NOT include any necessary right of way purchases nor any design, CEI, or environmental permitting fees. FDOT would need to estimate those during the Funding prioritization process. A reminder: SRC cannot purchase right of way for a federally funded project in advance of said project without going through the Federal Uniform Act procedure. Failure to follow this procedure results in forfeiture of funding.

RE: Alternatives for Incorporating the Proposed Navarre Beach Bridge into the Transportation Planning Process

ALTERNATIVES:

(1) Amend the currently-adopted TPO 2035 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) to include the proposed project. A request from the BOCC to the TPO to amend the 2035 LRTP would be appropriate to begin the amendment process.

- OR -

(2) Include the proposed project in the scheduled update of the LRTP. Direction to staff to include that project in the plan update would be appropriate to begin that process.

BACKGROUND:

The federally-mandated Transportation Planning Organization planning process is the standard avenue for planning, prioritizing and funding projects that anticipate the use of federal funds.

The primary components of that process are:

(1) The Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). Covering a period of at least 20 years and updated every 5 years, the LRTP includes both a Needs Plan and a Cost Feasible Plan. The Needs Plan identifies transportation facilities needed to accommodate the projected population through the planning period. The Cost Feasible Plan identifies those projects from the Needs Plan that can be funded based upon projected revenues.

(2) Project Priorities. Annually, the TPO updates and approves a list of Project Priorities from those projects listed in the Cost Feasible Plan. The Project Priorities are submitted to the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) for programming.

(3) FDOT Five Year Work Program. The TPO Project Priorities are considered by FDOT as they update their work program which includes those projects that are scheduled for implementation. The work program covers a period of five years and is updated annually.

(4) Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Following receipt of the FDOT 5-year Work Program, the TPO develops the TIP. The TIP includes projects funded through FDOT as well as locally-funded projects and is intended to be more user-friendly than the work program.

Because the first step toward federal funding of major transportation projects is the Long Range Transportation Plan, any new projects need to be incorporated into that plan. There are two ways to accomplish this:

- (1) Incorporate the proposed project into the currently-adopted LRTP by amendment
 - Estimated timeframe: 3 months
 - Under direction of the TPO, the TPO staff works with county staff to prepare and process the amendment, including development of a purpose and needs statement and solicitation of public input.
 - Absent an identified funding source, such an amendment would be included in the Needs Plan section of the LRTP.

- (2) Incorporate the proposed project into the LRTP through the regular plan update process which occurs every five years.
 - Estimated timeframe: currently underway with completion scheduled for 2015.
 - Prepared by consultants under contract with the TPO.
 - County planning and engineering staff involved as members of the TPO's Technical Coordinating Committee.
 - Public input throughout the process.

The primary difference between the two options is the timeframe.

NEXT STEPS:

Alternative 1 - Amendment of the 2035 LRTP: A request from the BOCC to the TPO to amend the 2035 LRTP would be appropriate to begin the amendment process.

Alternative 2 - Incorporation of the project into the pending LRTP: Direction to staff to include that project in the plan update would be sufficient action at this time.

ENCLOSURE 1 - PROCESS FOR AMENDING THE LRTP

Section 1.4 of the LRTP describes the plan amendment process as follows:

1.4 Long Range Plan Amendment and Modification Process

From time to time it becomes necessary to amend or modify the LRTP. The need for this may arise from an increase in funding and a project is moved from the Needs Plan to the Cost Feasible Plan. It may also arise from a significant change in the land use assumptions or other regionally significant changes. Should the need to amend or modify the Plan occur, the following procedure will be followed.

As per the Metropolitan Planning Organization Program Management Handbook and the requirements of SAFETEA-LU, the Long Range Transportation Plan may be amended or modified at any time. The plan amendment and modification process is subject to all the requirements of a plan update, including public involvement. Documentation shall include, but is not limited to, a revised analysis of the impacts of the proposed plan revision to the transportation system, documentation of the public involvement process, new maps, documentation and data files of the revised model and/or technique, and a revised balancing of project costs versus forecasted revenues. The TPO must adopt Long Range Transportation Plan amendments at an advertised TPO Public Hearing .

In the case of a modification to the LRTP, in which a project that is already included in the LRTP needs to be changed, edited or corrected, an inclusion of the project specific information shall be in the advertisement placed for the TPO meeting at which the modification will be brought to the TPO for approval.

Amendments may result from changes to the financial plan, the addition of new projects, and

changing priorities (for example, moving projects from the Needs Assessment to the Cost Feasible Plan). Any amendments to the LRTP will require a specific round of public outreach to include at least one advertised public workshop for each phase of the LRTP that will be affected by the inclusion or deletion of the proposed project in the LRTP. Any amendment to the LRTP will require that the entire plan be in compliance with all current regulations. An advertised public workshop and a public hearing at a TPO meeting will be done for each step of the Plan that needs to be amended, following the same steps as the entire LRTP process.

Applicants must submit a completed FRDAP Grant Application during an announced submission period. Applicants may submit up to two applications during the submission period. Applications must involve only one project site except for acquisition or development of sandy beach access.

What is the Maximum Grant Amount?

The maximum grant amount is \$200,000.

What are the Match Requirements?

The local match requirement depends on the total project cost:

Total Project, Cost FRDAP Grant, Local Match

\$50,000 or less, 100%, 0%

\$50,001 - 150,000, 75%, 25%

Over \$150,000, 50%, 50%

What Can I Use to Match a FRDAP Grant?

How are FRDAP Grants Awarded?

Each application is reviewed to determine eligibility. The Office of Information and Recreation Services evaluates each eligible application according to Florida Administrative Code and assigns a final score. Based on the scores, DEP prepares and submits a recommended priority list to the Florida Legislature for funding consideration.

Applications for FRDAP projects for the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 are due by September 30, 2013. Approximately \$640,000 was allocated during the 2013/2014 FRDAP cycle and this amount was applied entirely to small development projects of \$50,000. It is unclear at this time if any funding will be allocated in this upcoming cycle.

Tammy Simmons and I have reviewed several potential projects including six development and two acquisition projects. Attached is spreadsheet that identifies each project and the score likely to be received based on the recreation and support facilities that are proposed to be provided. In summary, the top two scoring development projects are Navarre Park improvements and Floridatown Park Improvements. Both of the land acquisition projects score nearly the same.

If should be noted that if an acquisition project receives a FRDAP grant, the applicant must develop the acquired site for public outdoor recreation use within three (3) years. Two applications can be submitted during the same application cycle. There is a 50% match requirement for grants requests over \$150,000, 25% match required for projects over \$50,000 and no match requirement for projects under \$50,000. Additional information on the grant opportunity is attached.

Board direction is needed with regards to which application(s) to pursue in this upcoming cycle as coordination is needed for public input meetings, preliminary site plan development, etc. Based on this direction, we will develop a project scope and application to be approved by the Board prior to the September 30, 2013 deadline. Please place this on the August 5, 2013 agenda for discussion. Let me know if you have any questions regarding this request.

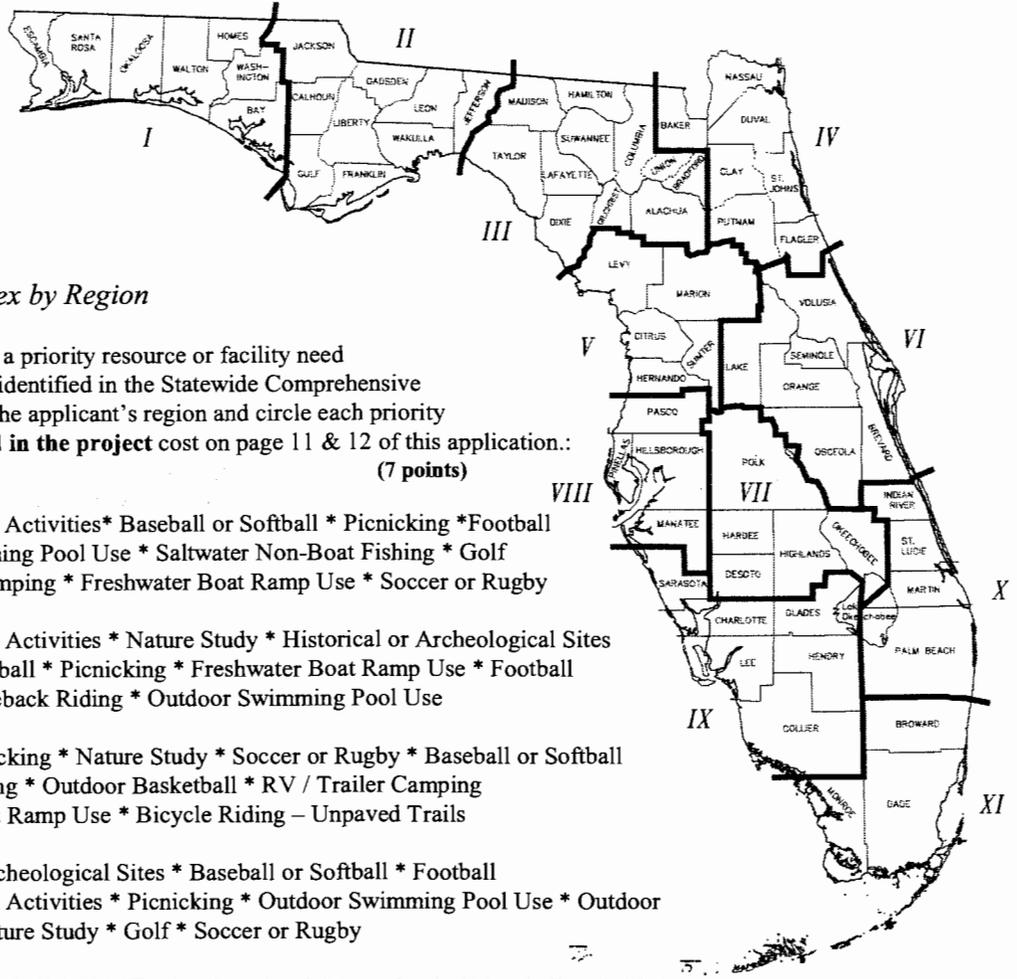

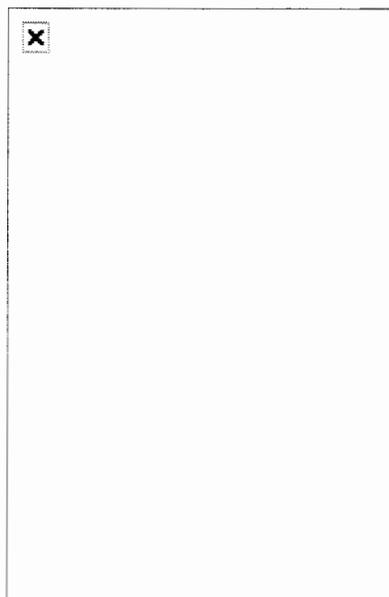

**AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO SANTA ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA;
AMENDING ORDINANCE 91-24 AS AMENDED; AMENDING ORDINANCE
2013-03; AMENDING THE LANGUAGE PERTAINING TO LOT SIZE;
AMENDING THE ZONING DISTRICT AS DEPICTED IN THE ATTACHED
MAPS; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN
EFFECTIVE DATE.**

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF SANTA
ROSA COUNTY, FLORIDA:**

SECTION 1. Section 2 of Santa Rosa County Ordinance 2013-03 is amended to read as follows: (Language added is printed in type which is **bold underline** type, and language deleted is printed in ~~struck through~~ type.).

SECTION 2. The zoning district category for Attachment A is amended as follows:

Attachment A - Case # 2013-R-001 - ID# 27-3N-30-0000-00501-0000 and 27-3N-30-0000-00502-0000- Rezone from Agriculture District 2 (AG-2) to Agriculture (AG). This rezoning is subject to the following conditions: 1. No access to Fox Pond Trail; and, 2. Density not to exceed 1 dwelling unit per 5 acres on parcel 27-3N-30-0000-00502-0000, no lot may be smaller than five (5) acres.

SECTION 3. CODIFICATION. The provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the code of laws and ordinances of the County of Santa Rosa. The sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or any other appropriate word.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. A copy of this Ordinance shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of State within ten (10) days of enactment. The rezoning amendment for Attachment A shall take effect upon the effective date of this ordinance.

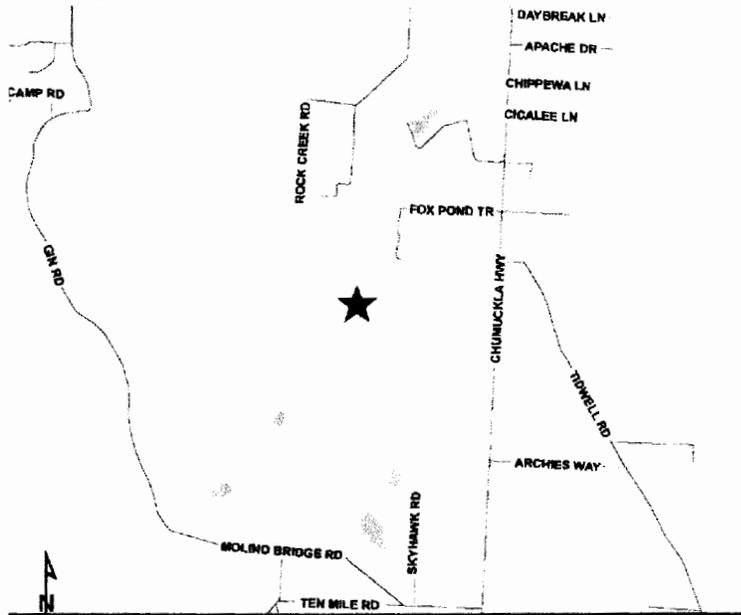

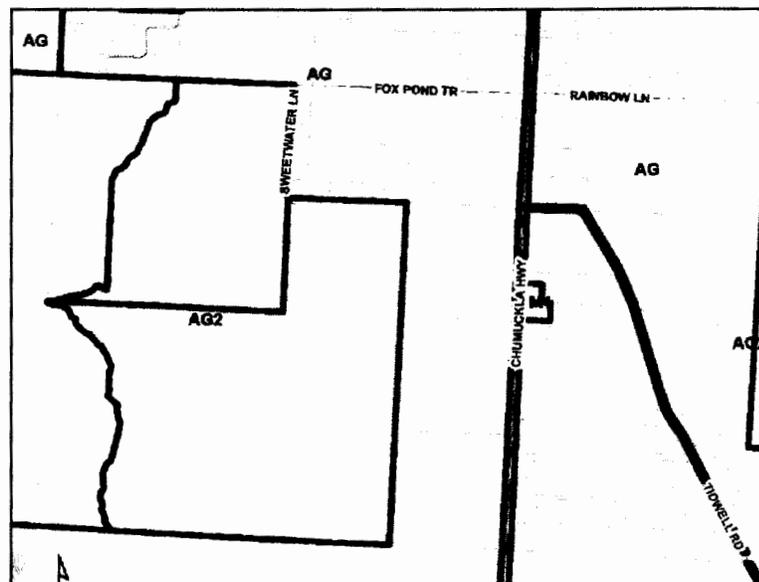

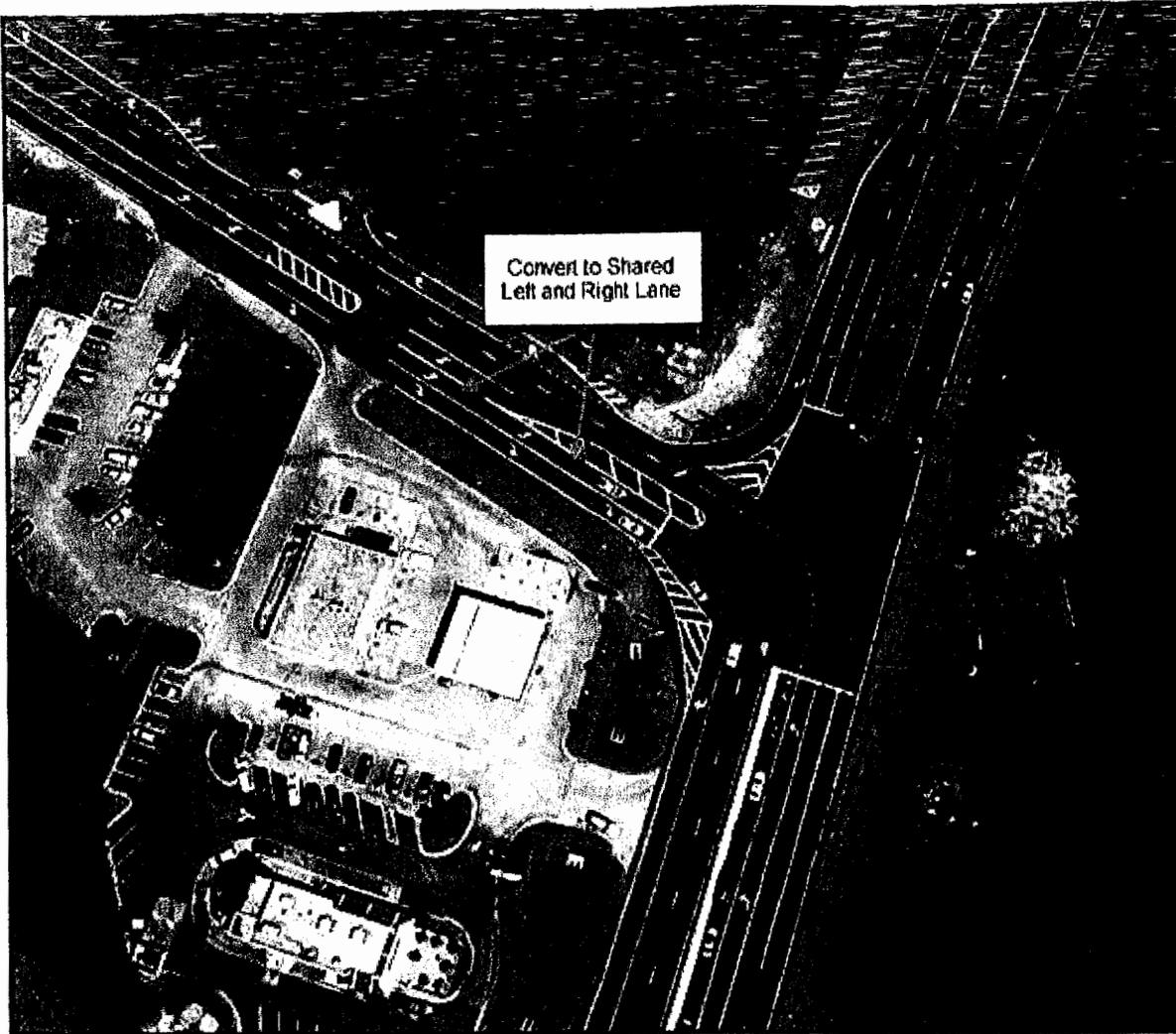

Roger,

Per our discussions, FDOT District Three Traffic Operations has analyzed the signalized intersection of SR 10 (US 90) and CR 197A (Woodbine Road) in Santa Rosa County. After reviewing the Synchro and SimTraffic models of this location, D3 Traffic Operations recommends that Santa Rosa County construct an additional right-turn lane on the southeast approach of CR 197A (Woodbine Road) to service approximately 800 right-turning vehicles in the AM Peak period. As you are painfully aware of, queue lengths on Woodbine are routinely in excess of 1 ½ miles during the AM Peak. According to the District Safety Office, this proposed improvement may qualify for off-system Safety Funds. Please coordinate with Mr. Jonathan Harris in our Safety Office to initiate the process (850-415-9516 or jonathan.harris@dot.state.fl.us).

As an interim measure, the Department recommends that Santa Rosa County modify the County maintained southeast approach of CR 197A (Woodbine Road) at SR 10 (US 90). The recommendation is to convert the existing dedicated left-turn lane on Woodbine to a shared left and right movement, thus allowing dual rights to service the high volume of right-turning vehicles in the AM Peak period.

The advantages of the proposed modification is a significant reduction in both delay time and queue length in the AM Peak period for Woodbine **and** westbound US 90 (southbound at this location). See attached reports. Please note that the proposed interim modifications are very minor and should be very minimal in cost (re-stripping, one upstream pole mounted sign on Woodbine depicting the intersection operation and two overhead signs mounted on the existing span wire to allow right-turns on red only from the far right right-turn lane).
