Tropical Storm Debby Update #3

Storm Information as Currently Forecasted by the National Weather Service

- Santa Rosa County is no longer under a Tropical Storm Warning.
- The Flash Flood Warning has been canceled.
- A high wind advisory and surf advisory are in effect until further notice. Santa Rosa County is expecting breezy conditions with possible gusts to 35 MPH. Rain chances have diminished. Tides could be up to 2 feet above normal and a high risk of rip currents is still present.

Actions Taken by Santa Rosa County

- The emergency operations center remains activated at level 3 with emergency management staff continuing to monitor National Weather Service advisories and local conditions. Due to the changing forecasted track overnight, the EOC did not go to level 2 at 7 a.m.
- The Local State of Emergency has been canceled.
- The Citizens Information Line is open at (850) 983-INFO (4636) but will close at 5 p.m. today.
- County offices and the courts system will continue to operate as normally scheduled.

Beach Conditions

- Double red flags are currently flying at Navarre Beach. Beachgoers, swimmers, and surfers should heed the flag warnings and stay out of the water as deadly rip currents and rough surf conditions are present.
- Beach Access #7 near Georgia Street is closed.

Traffic Conditions

- The National Park Service closed J Earl Bowden Way, between Pensacola Beach and Navarre Beach. The detour is U.S. Hwy. 98.
